Evacuation Plan

Purpose:

The purpose of the Town of Breckenridge Evacuation Plan is to serve as an evacuation guide for Breckenridge emergency responders and to educate the citizens and guests of Breckenridge on how to respond to an emergency requiring evacuation. The Emergency Evacuation Plan includes plans for both partial and full evacuation of the Town and surrounding neighborhoods. The Multi-Hazard Evacuation Plan is designed to manage, coordinate, and implement the evacuation of the Town of Breckenridge. Any large scale incident could result in severe effects to our citizens, infrastructure and economy.

Evacuations may be made necessary for a number of reasons. Some evacuations will be short term (less than 24 hours) while others may be for a longer term (more than 24 hours). Some evacuations may allow residents time to prepare (1 or 2 hours) while other orders for evacuation may only provide a few minute's notice. Therefore, evacuation orders will vary depending on each situation. This plan is general in nature. In the event of a real emergency or disaster, the Incident Command System will be utilized to manage the operational response. The Operations and Planning Sections will customize operational plans to meet the needs of the actual situation. Depending upon the nature and severity of the critical incident, the ICS Command and General Staff will establish operational periods with specific action plans for each operational period. These action plans will identify specific areas to be evacuated, evacuation routes, sheltering alternatives, staging areas and emergency ingress routes for responders.

Objectives:

1. Protection of life and property.
2. Timely and efficient notifications to the public.
3. Orderly evacuation of portions or the entirety of the Town of Breckenridge.
4. Manage the evacuation egress so as not to interfere with the ingress of emergency responders.
5. Maintain security during the evacuation period.
6. Safe and orderly return of evacuees.

Emergency Definition:

An emergency is defined as a situation, or the threat of an impending situation, having the potential to abnormally affect lives, property, the environment, or to threaten grave public disorder and by its nature and magnitude requires controlled and coordinated response by a number of agencies, as distinct from routine operations.

Potential Community Hazards:

1. Wildland Fire
2. Snowstorm/Blizzard
3. Flood
4. Hazardous Materials Release
5. Acts of Terrorism
6. Avalanche
7. Dam Failure
8. Drought
9. Earthquake
10. Landslide
11. Erosion and Deposition
12. Mass Transportation/Mass Casualty Incident
13. Utility Service Failure

If any emergency or disaster makes it necessary to evacuate all or any portion of the Town of Breckenridge, the following procedures will be followed.

Incident Information Messages:

An Incident Information Message is the first and general message to the public and media that the potential for a public safety issue exists. The Incident Information Message is to be issued by either the Incident Commander or the County Emergency Manager and stands to place citizens on notice that a situation may evolve into a greater threat to the community and that personal steps should be made to prepare for evacuation or shelter in place.

Types of Evacuation Orders:

1. Pre-Evacuation Order: This evacuation order is issued when it is believed that a hazard has a high probability of posing significant threat to people living in the areas at risk. Citizens are encouraged to leave the danger area; however, the decision to evacuate will be theirs. It will be issued when the probability of impact by the hazard is high and the vulnerability of the residents is great.
2. Mandatory Evacuation Order: This evacuation order is issued when it is believed that a hazard is almost certain to adversely impact the area. After a Mandatory Evacuation Order has been issued, all persons are required to evacuate the danger zone. If persons refuse to leave, they will be given lawful orders to leave and will be advised that no emergency resources will be endangered to rescue them at a later time. Refusal to evacuate may result in criminal charges being filed.

Action Steps of Evacuation Plan:

1. Incident Occurs
2. Emergency Services Respond
3. Situation Assessed
4. Incident Command System Activated
5. Declaration of Emergency
6. Emergency Plan Activated
7. Precautionary/Mandatory Evacuation Ordered by Incident Commanders
8. Evacuation Initiated
9. Security of Evacuated Areas Maintained by Law Enforcement
10. Return of Evacuees

Evacuation Incident Command Structure:

Evacuations will be managed through the Incident Command System. In most critical incidents of the magnitude requiring evacuation, either the Summit County Incident Management Team (IMT) or the Northwest Colorado Incident Management Team would be activated. In most cases, a unified command structure would be utilized.

Incident Command Operations and Planning Sections will determine the following:

1. Boundaries of area to be evacuated
2. Identify primary evacuation routes
3. Identify primary emergency vehicle ingress routes
4. Identify necessary traffic control points
5. Collection Centers identified
6. Identify Sheltering locations

Incident Commander shall:

1. Order the appropriate evacuation
2. Initiate public notification of evacuation

Public Notification:

When implementing the Emergency Evacuation Plan, the Summit County Communications Center will utilize the Emergency Phone Notification, also known as Reverse 911, the Emergency Alert System via AM/FM radio stations through notification of the National Weather Service in Boulder and Roam Secure (SC ALERT) text messages to **enrolled** cell phones, homes, hotels and businesses in the affected area(s). Additionally, messages will be delivered through Facebook (Town of Breckenridge Police Department) and Twitter (@BreckPolice). All messages will contain emergency and evacuation instructions.

The Public Information Officers will coordinate a Joint Information Center (JIC) to keep the public and the media updated on the nature of the emergency and evacuation procedures. As evacuations become probable, the PIO's will disseminate information to the public regarding evacuation preparation along with information on how to sustain themselves and members of their family for up to 72 hours. The JIC will conduct regular media briefings at an established location. Public Information Officers for the Town of Breckenridge and Red, White and Blue Fire Protection District will initiate periodic updates of the Town's website (www.townofbreckenridge.com) containing emergency evacuation instructions. Email and fax notifications will be sent to local lodging companies, the Breckenridge Resort Chamber and local media updating emergency information and evacuation procedures. Additionally, the JIC will disseminate information and a phone number for persons with disabilities needing public transportation to a sheltering location.

First responders will conduct door-to-door evacuations and/or drive through neighborhoods making public notifications on emergency loud speakers.

Authority to Enter Buildings and Premises:

“Whenever an emergency exists, the Town Manager, Building Official, Chief of Police, Police Officer or Community Service Officer, upon presentation of proper credentials or identification in the case of an occupied building or premises or possession of said credentials in the case of an unoccupied building or premises, may enter into any building or go upon any premises within the jurisdiction of the Town. In an emergency, such persons may use such reasonable force as may be necessary to gain entry into said

building or upon said premises.” (Town Ordinance 22, Series 1993; and Town Ordinance 64, Series 2003).

Evacuation Instructions:

- A. Self-Evacuation by Vehicle:
 - 1. Exit the area/neighborhood utilizing designated evacuation routes.
 - 2. If citizens have a private sheltering option (hotels, friends) out of the Breckenridge area, they should respond there.
 - 3. If no private sheltering option exists, respond to the designated Summit County sheltering locations.

- B. Evacuation by Public Transportation:
 - 1. Go to the nearest neighborhood bus stop.
 - 2. Citizens will be transported by a local circulator bus to the designated Collection Center.
 - 3. A public transportation option (Town bus, Summit Stage, School bus) will then take citizens to a sheltering location.

Citizens who self-evacuate or evacuate by public transportation will be asked to indicate that they have already evacuated their residence by displaying a large, white object, such as a sheet, inside the residence, in a visible, conspicuous location, in the front, street-side of their home and to turn on their porch light.

Safety Zones:

In the event that Hwy 9 is closed both north and south of Breckenridge, potential Safety Zones have been identified where residents and guests who have been evacuated may assemble until an evacuation route is open. The Command and General Staff will select Safety Zones depending upon the nature and complexity of the incident and the JIC will disseminate Safety Zone information to the public. Potential Safety Zones include:

- Colorado Mountain College
- Upper Blue Elementary
- Breckenridge Recreation Center
- North and South Gondola Lots
- Riverwalk Center
- Old Colorado Mountain College campus
- Breckenridge Elementary
- Breckenridge Golf Course
- Stephen C. West Ice Arena

The Town of Breckenridge Public Works Department will assign heavy equipment to patrol the bus and evacuation routes within the Town limits to keep them free from debris and open for egress and ingress.

Neighborhood Bus Stops for Public Transportation:

The primary neighborhood pick-up locations are the Town of Breckenridge bus stops. If possible, the buses will follow their regular routes. If a resident or guest is unable to make it to their neighborhood bus stop location, then they should respond to the nearest alternative bus stop or alternative pick-up location for a safe evacuation, which are listed below:

Alternative Pick-up Locations:

1. School (Upper Blue Elementary)
2. Beaver Run Resort
3. Breckenridge Recreation Center
4. Stephen C. West Ice Arena
5. Vista Point bus stop
6. Corner of Wellington and Ridge
7. F-Lot Bus Stop on Park
8. Peak 8 Base Area bus stop

Hotel shuttles will be requested to shuttle guests to the Breckenridge Transit Center on Park Avenue or a designated Secondary Collection Center. Persons with disabilities who are unable to go to the designated neighborhood transit pick up locations should call 911 for pick-up by appropriate public transportation. The Joint Information Center will disseminate information for persons with disabilities needing public transportation to a sheltering location.

Collection Areas:

PRIMARY Collection Center – Breckenridge Transit Center. The circulator buses and hotel shuttles will transport evacuees to the Transit Center for further transport to a Sheltering Center.

Pets:

American Red Cross policy does not permit pets inside public shelters. Certified service animals are not considered pets and will be allowed to stay with their owners. The Town will coordinate with the Red Cross and the Summit County Animal Shelter for temporary housing of pets of individuals who are housed in shelters. Pet owners should evacuate with their animals whenever possible. Pet owners are encouraged to make contingency plans with friends and family who could take in or care for animals in the event of an evacuation. See www.readycolorado.com for specific recommendations on pet evacuation preparations.

Residential Evacuation Advice Checklist:

Preparation:

In the event of an evacuation, the American Red Cross will prepare one or more Sheltering Centers to shelter evacuees, however, the Centers may not be immediately fully equipped to meet everyone's needs. Therefore, it is important for each evacuee to prepare in advance for their own needs during the initial hours of evacuation. The Public Information Officers will advise the public to prepare 72 Hour Emergency Kits to sustain all family members until a full support response can be mustered. See www.ready.gov , www.readycolorado.com or www.redcross.org for more details regarding 72 hour preparation.

If time is available or notice of intent to evacuate the area is given, the following preparations should be immediately undertaken by residents:

1. Gather medications and be prepared to share special medication needs with the Registrar at the Sheltering Center.
2. Ensure all local family members are aware of the impending situation and your evacuation intentions.
3. Private motor vehicles should be prepared and fueled.
4. Emergency supplies should be readied.
5. Secure your home on departure.
6. Alert family members/friends outside of the Breckenridge area of the impending situation and your evacuation intentions.

American Red Cross Sheltering Centers:

Listed below are potential Sheltering Centers identified by the American Red Cross. Evacuees will be advised of the Sheltering Center(s) that will be opened during a specific incident.

Additionally, an American Red Cross trailer is pre-stocked and positioned within the Town of Breckenridge to assist in opening an emergency shelter. By American Red Cross policy, registered sex offenders are not allowed in public shelters and will be sheltered separately. The Breckenridge Police Department will provide the Red Cross with the names of registered sex offenders registered in the Town of Breckenridge.

Traffic Control Points:

Traffic control may be required at the following intersections to facilitate egress of evacuees and ingress of emergency responders. Traffic control points within the Town of Breckenridge include:

Schools and Daycare Centers:

School children will be evacuated in accordance with the school/day care center Emergency Policies and Procedures.

Security:

To ensure the evacuation is complete:

Security of vacated areas will be maintained by Law Enforcement.

During an evacuation, roadblocks into the area will be maintained by the Police, supplemented by designated emergency responder/volunteer assistance, as required.

Access to an evacuated area will be restricted to authorized emergency personnel.

Only when the area is determined to be safe shall residents with proper identification be allowed to return to the area. Depending on the circumstances, residents will initially be allowed in the area to remove personal items from residences, however, occupancy will not be allowed until utility services have been restored and structures have been deemed to be safe. Every effort will be made to verify the identity of persons claiming to be residents but without identification, however, if identity cannot be determined persons will not be allowed into secure areas. Members of the media will be allowed into secure areas during organized media tours and/or when accompanied by authorized persons.

Human and Animal Evacuation Flagging System:

As part of the evacuation procedure, emergency personnel will go door to door in an attempt to ensure that all residents of the area have been notified of the evacuation order and to assist any persons who wish to leave but are unable to do so. Emergency responders shall utilize a designated flagging system to classify the status of the structure, occupants and animals. Emergency responders will place a colored tape on the front door of the structure and at the end of the driveway to indicate the occupancy status. Emergency responders will record occupancy status in map

Green – Occupant was contacted and understands evacuation condition.

Yellow – Contact attempted. No contact made.

Blue – Pets or livestock unattended at residence. Can be combined with **Green** or **Yellow**.

Red – Occupant refuses to leave the property.

Special Needs Population:

There are citizens and guests that will require assistance leaving their residence or those who have medical needs that require electricity in the case of a power outage. Persons with disabilities requiring assistance should call 911 advising their location and their need to evacuate. This is only for those who do not have transportation and cannot make it to the designated evacuation center or neighborhood pick-up bus stop location.

Breckenridge Ski Area:

Depending on the nature of the emergency, the Incident Commander will determine whether people who are on the Breckenridge Ski Area mountains will be directed to remain on the mountain or to evacuate. If an evacuation is ordered, Breckenridge Ski Area employees will then route mountain visitors and staff to public transportation at the base of Peaks 8 and 9.

Return of Evacuees:

1. The Incident Commander, Safety Officer, Operations Section Chief and Building Officials will monitor the area in order to determine when the area(s) is safe for return.
2. The Incident Commander will approve the order to allow residents to return.
3. Designated return routes and appropriate public information will be provided to evacuees through local media.

Primary Evacuation Routes:

Northbound Hwy 9 to I-70 is designated as the primary evacuation route out of Breckenridge. Southbound Hwy 9 over Hoosier Pass is designated as the secondary evacuation route out of Breckenridge. All evacuation routes identified in this plan direct motor vehicle traffic to Hwy 9 for either a northbound or southbound egress.

The following evacuation routes are organized to be compatible with the Summit County Government map numbering system. Map numbers 47, 48, 49, 54, 56, 57, 60 and 62 denote the incorporated town limits of Breckenridge.

Evacuation Routes

Map 47 – Tiger Road

Tiger Road – (Chestnut Lane, Highfield Trail, Linden Lane, Oak Lane)

Chestnut Lane

Primary - South on Chestnut Lane, South (Right) on Highfield Trail, West (Right) on Tiger Rd to Hwy 9.

Highfield Trail

Primary - South on Highfield Trail, West (Right) on Tiger Rd to Hwy 9.

Linden Lane

Primary - South on Linden Lane, South (Left) on Highfield Trail, West (Right) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Oak Lane

Primary - South on Oak Lane, South (Right) on Highfield Trail, West (Right) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Primary - West on Byron Ct., West (Right) on Golden Age Drive, West (Left) on Preston Way, South (Left) on Highlands to Hwy 9.

Secondary - West on Byron Ct., West (Right) on Golden Age Drive, West (Left) on Preston Way, North (Right) on Highlands, West (Left) On Highlands Drive at Preston Way, North (Left) on Club House Drive, West (Left) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Clubhouse Drive

Primary - North on Clubhouse Dr, West (Left) on Tiger Rd. to Hwy 9.

Secondary - South on Clubhouse Dr., South (Right) on Highlands Dr., South (Right) on Highlands Dr., at Preston Way, Highlands Dr. to Hwy 9.

Evans Court

Primary - West on Evans Ct., West (Right) on Preston Way, South (Left) on Highlands to Hwy 9.

Secondary - West on Evans Ct., West (Right) on Preston Way, North (Right) on Highlands Dr., West (Left) On Highlands Drive at Preston Way, North (Left) on Club House Drive, West (Left) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Fairways Drive

Primary - West on Fairways Dr., North (Right) on Highlands Dr., North (Left) on Clubhouse Dr., West (Left) on Tiger Rd. to Hwy 9.

Secondary - West on Fairways Dr., South (Left) on Highlands Dr., South (Right) on Highlands Dr. at Preston Way., South on Highlands to Hwy 9.

Tertiary - East on Fairways, North (Left) on Gold Run Rd., North (Left) on Gold Run Rd. at Gold Hill., West (Left) on Tiger Rd to Hwy 9.

Golden Age Drive

Primary - West on Golden Age Drive, West (Left) on Preston Way, South (Left) on Highlands to Hwy 9.

Secondary - West on Golden Age Drive, West (Left) on Preston Way, North (Right) on Highlands, West (Left) On Highlands Drive at Preston Way, North (Left) on Club House Drive, West (Left) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Gold Run Road

Primary - East on Gold Run Rd, West (Left) on Tiger Rd to Hwy 9.

Secondary - West on Gold Run Rd, West (Right) on Glen Eagle Loop, West (Left) on Fairways Dr., North (Right) on Highlands Dr., North (Left) on Clubhouse Dr., West (Left) on Tiger Rd. to Hwy 9.

Glen Eagle Loop

Primary - East on Glen Eagle Loop, North (Left) on Gold Run Rd, North (Left) on Gold Run Rd. at Gold Hill., West (Left) on Tiger Rd to Hwy 9.

Secondary - West on Glen Eagle Loop, West (Right) on Fairways Dr, North (Right) on Highlands Dr, (Left) on Clubhouse Dr., West (Left) on Tiger Rd. to Hwy 9.

Glenwood Circle

Primary - East on Glenwood Cir, North (Left) on Highlands Dr, North (Left) Clubhouse Dr, West (Left) on Tiger Rd to Hwy 9.

Secondary - East on Glenwood Cir, South (Right) on Highlands Dr., South (Right) on Highlands Dr., at Preston Way, Highlands Dr. to Hwy 9.

Highlands Drive

Primary – Highlands Drive South to Hwy 9.

Secondary - Highlands Drive North, West (Left) On Highlands Drive at Preston Way, North (Left) on Club House Drive, West (Left) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Marks Lane

Primary - South on Marks Ln, West (Right) on Marksberry Ln, West (Left) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Marksberry Lane

Primary - West on Marksberry Ln, West (Left) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Mumford Place

Primary – North on Mumford Pl., North (Left) on Highlands Dr., North (Left) on Clubhouse Dr., West (Left) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Secondary – North on Mumford Pl., South (Right) on Highlands Dr., South (Right) on Highlands Dr., at Preston Way, Highlands Dr. to Hwy 9.

Preston Way

Primary - West on Preston Way, South (Left) on Highlands Dr., Highlands to Hwy 9.

Secondary - West on Preston Way, North (Right) on Highlands, West (Left) On Highlands Drive at Preston Way, North (Left) on Club House Drive, West (Left) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Spaulding Terrace

Primary - East on Spaulding Terr., South (Right) on Highlands Dr., to Hwy 9

Secondary - East on Spaulding Terr., North (Left) on Highlands Dr., West (Left) On Highlands Drive at Preston Way, North (Left) on Club House Drive, West (Left) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Westerman Rd.(H-5)

Primary - West on Westerman Rd., West (Right) on Preston Way, South (Left) on Highlands Dr. to Hwy 9.

Secondary - West on Westerman Rd., West (Right) on Preston Way North (Right) on Highlands Dr., West (Left) On Highlands Drive at Preston Way, North (Left) on Club House Drive, West (Left) on Tiger Road to Hwy 9.

Dyer Trail

- Primary - North on Dyer Trail to Highlands Drive. Left onto Highlands Drive to Hwy 9. Turn left or right onto Hwy 9 and proceed out of town.
- Secondary - East on Dyer Trail to Rounds Road. Left onto Rounds Road to Highlands Drive. Left onto Highlands Drive to Hwy 9. Turn left or right onto Hwy 9 and proceed out of town.
- Tertiary - East on Dyer Trail to Rounds Road. Left onto Rounds Road to Highlands Drive. Left onto Highlands Drive to Hwy 9. Follow Highlands Drive through to Tiger Road. Turn left onto Tiger Road to Hwy 9. Turn left or right onto Hwy 9 and proceed out of town.

Forest Circle

- Primary - North on Forest Circle to Dyer Trail. Left onto Dyer Trail to Highlands Drive. Left onto Highlands Drive to Hwy 9. Turn left or right onto Hwy 9 and proceed out of town.
- Secondary- North on Forest Circle to Dyer Trail. Right onto Dyer Trail to Rounds Road. Left onto Rounds Road to Highlands Drive. Right onto Highlands Drive to Hwy 9. Turn left or right onto Hwy 9 and proceed out of town.
- Tertiary- North on Forest Circle to Dyer Trail. Right onto Dyer Trail to Rounds Road. Left onto Rounds Road to Highlands Drive. Follow Highlands Drive through to Tiger Road. Turn left onto Tiger Road to Hwy 9. Turn left or right onto Hwy 9 and proceed out of town

Spencer Court

- Primary - North on Spencer Court to Dyer Trail. Left onto Dyer Trail to Highlands Drive. Left onto Highlands Drive to Hwy 9. Turn left or right onto Hwy 9 and proceed out of town.
- Secondary- North on Spencer Court to Dyer Trail. Right onto Dyer Trail to Rounds Road. Left onto Rounds Road to Highlands Drive. Turn right onto Highlands Drive to Hwy 9. Turn left or right onto Hwy 9 and proceed out of town.
- Tertiary- North on Spencer Court to Dyer Trail. Right onto Dyer Trail to Rounds Road. Left onto Rounds Road to Highlands Drive. Follow Highlands Drive through to Tiger Road. Turn left onto Tiger Road to Hwy 9. Turn left or right onto Hwy 9 and proceed out of town.

Rounds Road

Primary- North on Rounds Road to Highlands Drive. Turn left onto Highlands Drive, follow through to Hwy 9. Turn left or right onto Hwy 9 and proceed out of town.

Secondary- North on Rounds Road to Highlands Drive. Turn right onto Highlands Drive and follow through to Tiger Road. Turn left onto Tiger Road to Hwy 9. Turn left or right onto Hwy 9 and proceed out of town.

Barney Ford
